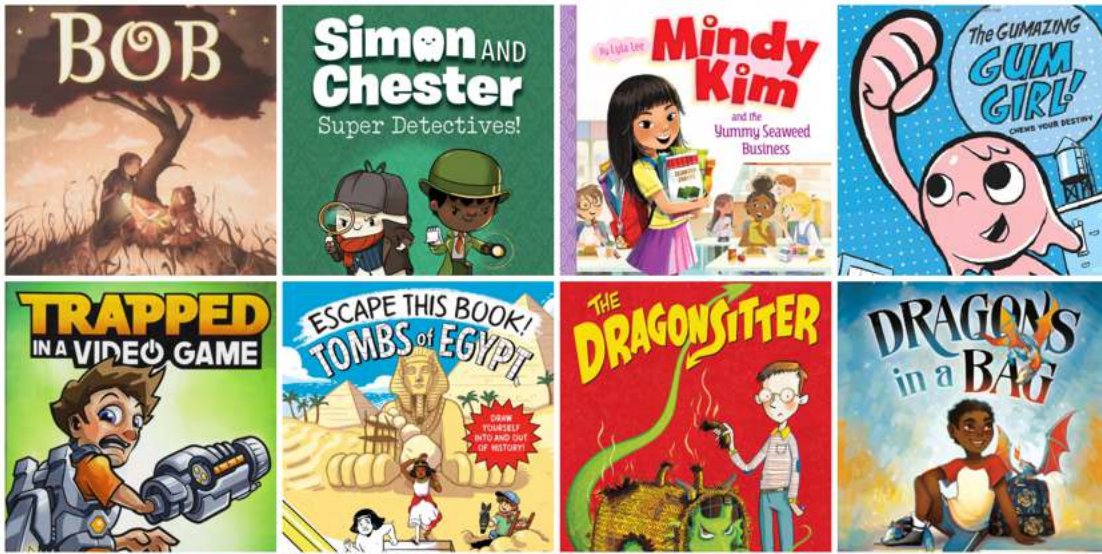
Class Presentation: You will take the items out of your bag one at a time to tell about your story's elements when you share with the class.
